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Piaget's Stages of Cognitive Development

Piaget and Education Emphasis on Discovery Learning:

- children encouraged to discover information themselves. Teachers provide activities to promote exploration and discovery.
- Sensitivity to Readiness to Learn: learning must be based on level of child's thinking.
